

Green Card: Document Requirements

- Passport (only pages containing immigration stamps and information/photo)
- Certificate of Citizenship (if not born in country issuing your passport)
- All prior/current US Visa Stamps in your passport
- I-94 documents; any/all that you have in your records
- EAD Cards (any, including any time you were on OPT and/or STEM OPT)
- I-20 forms if you were ever in F status (all I-20's needed, not only the most recent)
- Any J-1 Status Documents (all DS-2019's, I-612 waiver, etc.)
- All USCIS I-797 approval notices.
- Current, updated, resume (CV) including current employer details
- Education Documents
 - Diploma for each degree
 - Transcripts for coursework for each degree
 - Credential evaluation report(s), if any for a non- US degree
- Certificates and/or License required to practice your profession (i.e. teaching license, P.E. license, E.I.T., etc.)
- Any official name change documents, if applicable
- Relevant documentation for any arrests, criminal charges, court hearings, etc. (even if all charges dropped and/or expunged, we still need to see and review the information)
- Marriage Certificates as well as any divorce/death certificate(s) for former spouse(s).
- Birth Certificate (must be issued by a government agency or civil authority and must include a person's full name, date of birth, place of birth, AND both parents names.
- Employment verification letters from prior employers. If you have letters in hand already, we'd like to see those but DO NOT seek out new ones, we'll guide you through anything new that is needed.

**It is likely that we have some of this information from working on any of your non-immigrant petitions. If you feel as though we already have some of this information, please alert your case manager to avoid the need to send something twice.
